

## Charter

- 1. The C/O Vienna Magazine is an independent, bilingual medium that is published once a year in print and weekly online. It is published by the Redaktionsbuero Ost, in which no other company, group or publishing house has an ownership.
- 2. The magazine is committed to truthful reporting. The editorial staff creates the magazine freely and independently and checks the facts, also in quotations, to the best of their knowledge and belief.
- 3. No editor must be forced to express an opinion other than his/her own or to publish or illustrate untruthful facts or misrepresented quotations against the will of the interviewee.
- 4. C/O Vienna Magazine stands for a critical public, refers to the fundamental right of freedom of expression, and is committed to journalism that sees itself as the "fourth regulating power" in the state, also regulating against the "fifth power" of lobbying and social media.
- 5. C/O Vienna advocates human rights and their protection. C/O Vienna Magazine rejects all forms of discrimination and is committed to fundamental democratic values.
- 6. C/O Vienna especially wants to give a voice to those who, due to their social position, origin, gender, age, or sexual orientation, do not receive publicity and are unable to express their opinions or only under difficult conditions.
- 7. The editors categorically reject any attempt by individual companies, institutions, persons, political parties, economically, religiously or ideologically oriented groups to influence the content.
- 8. Advertisements or cooperations are to be identified as such and external sponsoring of travel and research is to be made transparent.
- 9. The topics and contents of the magazine are developed, discussed and decided upon together with the editors during regular editorial meetings. In cases of conflict, the decision is the responsibility of the editor-in-chief. She is responsible for the content.
